DAY 1: ARRIVE IN COPENHAGEN, DENMARK

Welcome to Copenhagen! At 6 pm, meet your Tour Director and travel companions for a welcome dinner at your hotel. (D)

DAY 2: COPENHAGEN

COPENHAGEN Guided sightseeing includes the royal reception rooms in Christiansborg Palace, and The Little Mermaid statue. Enjoy a free afternoon before visiting Tivoli Gardens.

HISTORIC SPOT Christiansborg Palace commands the scene on the islet of Slotsholmen with an 800 year-long history as Denmark's seat of power in central Copenhagen. This magnificent site houses the Danish Parliament, Prime Minister's office, and Denmark's Supreme Court. The magnificent palace is also home to visiting Danish monarchs with its resplendent royal reception rooms, chapel, and royal stables. (B)

DAY 3: COPENHAGEN-ELSINORE-GOTHENBURG, SWEDEN-OSLO, NORWAY

ELSINORE Ferry crossing to Helsingborg, Sweden. GOTHENBURG Take an orientation drive. Visit the indoor food market and taste local snacks.

LOCAL TASTES At Gothenburg's indoor market hall you can find spices, coffee, cheese, fruit, and other delicacies from around the world in its 40 shops and eateries. Whilst strolling around the stalls enjoy a Swedish food experience and sample some of the local specialties. (B, D)

DAY 4: OSLO

OSLO Guided sightseeing includes a walk through Frogner Park and a visit to City Hall.

ART & ARCHITECTURE Frogner Park contains over 200 sculptures in granite, bronze, and wrought iron, along with fountains and bridges comprising the life's work of legendary sculptor Guztav Vigeland. Visit the stately Oslo City Hall, with its red-brick architecture, soaring towers, and 49 bells. Here, the Nobel Peace Prize ceremony takes place each year (B).

DAY 5: OSLO-STOCKHOLM, SWEDEN

OSLO Scenic drive to Stockholm

EPIC RIDE A myriad of small lakes and little villages dot the Scandinavian landscapes from Oslo to Stockholm. You'll enjoy serene natural beauty and lush green views along the way from Norway to Sweden.(B)

DAY 6: STOCKHOLM

STOCKHOLM Guided walking tour of the Old Town. Visit the City Hall and the Vasa Ship Museum.

CULTURE & TRADITION Set your course for the Vasa Ship Museum in Stockholm. Here, you'll cruise back through maritime days to see the historic Vasa - the Swedish war ship which capsized and sank on her maiden voyage off Stockholm 1628. (B)

DAY 7: STOCKHOLM-OVERNIGHT CRUISE TO HELSINKI, FINLAND

STOCKHOLM Free time this morning. Take an overnight cruise with dinner to Helsinki.

CULTURAL GEMS Called "the capital of cool," Stockholm is the place for music, art, and fashion. With nearly 100 museums, Stockholm has more museums per capita than almost anywhere else in the world. Sustainable and eco-friendly solutions are a big part of everyday life in Stockholm. Many restaurants focus on locally sourced seasonal ingredients where a city skyline rise above lush, green spaces. DAY 8: HELSINKI

HELSINKI Guided sightseeing includes the Lutheran Cathedral, Sibelius Monument, and the open-air market.

CULTURE & TRADITION Finland's southern capital of Helsinki is poised on the peninsula in the Gulf of Finland, where striking architecture and Nordic cuisine delight visitors. Stroll the open-air market for traditional fare and see the beautiful cathedral and Sibelius Monument in this historic and picturesque setting. (B)

DAY 9: HELSINKI

HELSINKI Enjoy a free day, followed by a farewell dinner tonight at your hotel.

EXPLORE MORE with an excursion to Tallin, the capital city of Estonia on the Gulf of Finland. The coastal gem on the Baltic Sea combines an exciting mix of old and new with promenades and pristine beaches.
